3-655 of the South Carolina Code (Supp. 2013) that he committed CSC by "intrusion by an object." We affirm pursuant to Rule 220(b), SCACR, and the following authorities: *State v. Byers*, 392 S.C. 438, 444, 710 S.E.2d 55, 58 (2011) (holding that for an objection to be preserved for appellate review, the objection must be made "with sufficient specificity to inform the circuit court judge of the point being urged by the objector" (citing *Wilder Corp. v. Wilke*, 330 S.C. 71, 76, 497 S.E.2d 731, 733 (1998))); *State v. Dunbar*, 356 S.C. 138, 142, 587 S.E.2d 691, 693-94 (2003) ("Issues not raised and ruled upon in the trial court will not be considered on appeal."); *id.* at 142, 587 S.E.2d at 694 ("A party may not argue one ground at trial and an alternate ground on appeal."); *State v.
